This is the first newsletter for 2015 and yes, it's AGM time next month!


AGM Sunday 3 May at 3pm in the

He will focus on his Devonport work, especially the seawall and groyne at Devonport Beach.

ACQUISITIONS The museum has been very fortunate to have received several interesting donations in the past few months. They include the wedding dress worn by Mabel Florence "Floss" Duder at her marriage to George Panton Finlay (later Hon. Sir George) at Holy Trinity Church on 30<sup>th</sup> March 1912, with all the

documentation and original photos. We have also received an arithmometer (come and see it – it's like a very early computer!), an ornate Victorian toilet, a canvas invalid's chair, some vintage tools, and the research and records of the late John Earnshaw pertaining to North Head and the mystery of the hidden planes. This material will be available for research after it has been catalogued by Gail Griffin.

We always welcome contributions of items which help to tell Devonport Stories. Work on displays and planning continues. Thanks to John Sala for the skill and effort he is putting into display cabinets for our tool collection. We are working on the preservation of a large wheel and on future displays of Edwardian an Victorian Devonport.



Our display of the "Devonport left behind" by local men who went to the First World War and of those who did not return will be in our gallery until May. We will then move it to our small gallery upstairs in the Old Council Chambers, at 3 Victoria St.
